EMERGENCY

Present to appropriate Emergency
Department (ED) for immediate
assessment and treatment

URGENT

Appointment timeframe 29 days of referral receipt

ROUTINE

Appointment timeframe greater than 29 days of referral receipt, depending on clinical need and will be added to a waiting list
