The Cancer Consumer-led Research Partnership is a pioneering, statewide, multi-stakeholder initiative that amplifies the voices of cancer consumers through engagement, research and education. Made possible by the Department of Health's \$1.6M investment, this collaborative effort involves five cancer control organisations: VCCC Alliance, Regional Trial Network – Victoria, Monash Partners Comprehensive Cancer Consortium, Cancer Council Victoria, and University of Melbourne.
