
**Grand Round Event- Nurses and Research - Why it matters.**

## Congratulations to Dr Rami Subhi and team on their Lancet Publication!



Rami, a Global Health Research Fellow, is undertaking a PhD focused on understanding medical oxygen systems in low-resource settings. His research asks a critical question: why do the majority of patients in low-income and middle-income countries (LMICs)—not receive medical oxygen when they need it, resulting in countless preventable deaths and heartache? The COVID-19 pandemic brought this inequity into sharp focus, but the problem persists well beyond the crisis.

This work not only highlights ongoing gaps but also sets a baseline for future research to track progress. Rami and his team hope to drive meaningful change by drawing attention to this persisting problem.
