Our 12-month GMP has intakes in February and May annually, with graduates working a rotating roster, 8 days per fortnight.

Thorough orientation, supernumerary time and professional development days strengthen the theoretical components of the program. Access to online resources, workshops, seminars and in-services further builds knowledge and confidence.
